Our school-based phonics programme and guided reading equip students with decoding skills, letter-sound relationship and reading strategies for approaching different text types.




READ TO LEARN (KS2)

LIVE THE LANGUAGE


Life-wide learning activities in real contexts and authentic settings hone their language skills, foster positive values and enable lifelong learning capability for the ever-changing 21st century.

Students explore the traditional art of Lokta paper from Nepal by designing and stamping their own handmade study notebooks.




READING ACROSS THE CURRICULUM




NETsJam
